<p><b><u>Standing Order Medications</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Anesthetic lidocaine for IO needle insertion</li><li>• Aspirin</li><li>• EpiPen auto injector</li><li>• Glucagon - hypoglycemia</li><li>• IV dextrose</li><li>• Naloxone</li><li>• Nerve Agent antidote</li><li>• Nitroglycerin sublingual standing order, agency supplied</li><li>• Nitroglycerin sublingual, patient assisted</li><li>• Oral glucose</li><li>• Over-the-counter medications (acetaminophen, ibuprofen, etc)</li><li>• Oxygen</li><li>• Topical hemostatic agents</li></ul>	<p><b><u>Standing Order Medications</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Anesthetic lidocaine for IO needle insertion</li><li>• Aspirin</li><li>• CN antidote kit</li><li>• EpiPen auto injector</li><li>• Glucagon - hypoglycemia</li><li>• IV dextrose</li><li>• Naloxone</li><li>• Nerve Agent antidote</li><li>• Nitroglycerin sublingual (agency supplied and patient assisted)</li><li>• Ophthalmic (ophthaine and tetracaine)</li><li>• Oral glucose</li><li>• Over-the-counter medications (acetaminophen, ibuprofen, etc)</li><li>• Oxygen</li><li>• Topical hemostatic agents</li></ul>

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<p><b><u>Base Contact Required</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Albuterol and ipratropium MDI, agency supplied</li><li>• Albuterol and ipratropium MDI, patient assisted</li><li>• Albuterol, agency supplied (neb)</li><li>• Diphenhydramine</li><li>• Epinephrine 1:1000 IM or SC – allergy/anaphylaxis</li><li>• Ipratropium, agency supplied (neb)</li><li>• Nitro paste</li></ul>	<p><b><u>Base Contact Required</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Adenosine</li><li>• Albuterol and ipratropium MDI, agency supplied and patient assisted</li><li>• Albuterol, agency supplied (neb)</li><li>• Amiodarone (all indications, dosing)</li><li>• Antiemetics (metaclopramide, ondansetron, promethazine)</li><li>• Atropine</li><li>• Benzodiazepines (diazepam, lorazepam, midazolam) – (all dosing/indications/routes require call in.)</li><li>• Diphenhydramine</li><li>• Epinephrine 1:10000</li><li>• Epinephrine 1:1000 IM or SC</li><li>• Furosemide</li><li>• Glucagon – beta-blocker/calcium channel blocker OD</li><li>• Haloperidol</li><li>• Ipratropium</li><li>• Methylprednisolone</li><li>• Nitro paste</li><li>• Opioids (fentanyl, morphine)</li><li>• Racemic Epinephrine</li><li>• Sodium bicarbonate</li></ul>

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**Paramedic**

**Standing Order Medications**

- Adenosine
- Albuterol (all indications, routes)
- Amiodarone – bolus infusion
- Anesthetic lidocaine for IO infusion
- Antiemetics (metaclopramide, ondansetron, promethazine)
- Aspirin
- Atropine
- Benzodiazepines (lorazepam, diazepam, midazolam) – all dosing/indications/routes (except sedation for pacing which requires call in)
- Calcium gluconate all indications
- Cyanide antidote kits
- Diphenhydramine
- Epinephrine (all dosing/indications/routes except continuous infusion)
- Furosemide
- Glucagon
- Haloperidol
- Ipratropium (all indications, routes)
- IV dextrose
- Magnesium sulfate bolus for torsades de pointes or eclampsia
- Methylprednisolone all indications
- Naloxone
- Nerve agent antidote
- Nitroglycerin (all routes, indications)
- Ophthalmic topical anesthetics
- Opioids (morphine, fentanyl, hydromorphone)
- Oral glucose
- Over-the-counter medications (acetaminophen, ibuprofen, etc)
- Pralidoxime
- Racemic epinephrine
- Sodium bicarbonate

**Paramedic**

**Base Contact Required**

- Amiodarone drip for stable wide complex tachycardia
- Benzodiazepines for sedation for transcutaneous cardiac pacing (Subsequent doses)
- Calcium gluconate for calcium channel blocker OD
- Dopamine
- Epinephrine continuous infusion for shock states
