 - a. Added line for Ondansetron to limit IO to AEMT and up.
- 4. 1080 Needle Thoracostomy
 - a. Information on catheter size added for pediatrics.
- 5. 1110 Intraosseous Catheter Placement
 - a. Language update regarding lidocaine administration.
- 6. 4130 Epistaxis
 - a. Added statement in the grey box after anterior epistaxis may require up to 30 min of constant pressure to stop bleeding.
- 7. 5010 Hypothermia
 - a. Language added on active and passive rewarming.
- 8. 5020 Hyperthermia
 - a. Language added on cooling techniques.
- 9. Trauma Protocol Section
 - a. Comprehensive review and edit of entire trauma section to streamline protocols.

 - iii. 8110 Trauma in Pregnancy Language added regarding high-risk refusal with estimated gestational age ≥20 weeks.

 - a. PO administration for fever added to indications.
- 11. 9060 Atropine
 - a. Change to adult dose for hemodynamically unstable bradycardia.
- 12. 9070 Benzodiazepines
 - a. IM route added to diazepam.
- 13. 9100 Diphenhydramine
 - a. For mild allergic reactions, PO is added as an option for adults and pediatric.
- 14. 9120 Epinephrine
 - a. Requires medical director approval for implementation Pediatric IV push dose for systemic allergic reactions after three unsuccessful IM administrations.
- 15. 9210 Naloxone
 - a. IN added with severe respiratory compromise.
- 16. 9220 Nitroglycerin
 - a. Reference to nitro paste move to extended care supplements.
- 17. 9225 NSAIDS
 - a. Ibuprofen administration for fever added to indications.
- 18. **NEW** Extended care supplements These are intended to augment the existing Denver Metro EMS protocols, not to supersede, replace, or otherwise contradict them. They require medical director approval for implementation. These include the following:
